

**FINAL RESULTS**

ReachTEL conducted a survey of 1,471 residents across Western Australia. The survey was conducted the night of 14<sup>th</sup> March 2017.

**Question 1:**

*Thinking about the recent state election on Saturday, who of the following received your first preference vote?*
