

## Statement on Bill Shorten's retirement from federal politics

From his early days as a trainee at the ACTU in 1994, alongside current ACTU Secretary Sally McManus, to his membership of the ACTU Executive and his leadership during the 2006 Beaconsfield Mine collapse in Tasmania, Bill has always advocated for workers and their families.

As Secretary of the Australian Workers' Union, Bill united the union and won better pay and conditions for workers across a diverse range of industries, including manufacturing, mining, construction, agriculture, utilities, administration and the arts.
